Answers

Grid A

- The Rugby Union Varsity match** CORRECT Takes place in December every year at Twickenham
- Australian Open Tennis** INCORRECT Is the first Grand Slam of the year but it is played in January.
- World Swimming Champs** CORRECT Short course version held every 2 years in December
- Super Bowl** INCORRECT Held in February.
- European Women's Handball** CORRECT Played every 2 years in December in European cities.
- UK Snooker Championship Final** CORRECT Held every year in December
- US Masters Golf** INCORRECT Played every year in April
- Men's Surfing Championship** CORRECT Held in Hawaii every year in December
- Olympia Horse Show** CORRECT Held in London every year in December hosting World Cup Showjumping and dressage.

Grid B

- Camel Spin** INCORRECT A spin on one leg with the non-skating leg extended parallel to the ice and the upper body pitched forward, arms extended.
- Toe Loop** CORRECT A toe-pick-assisted jump that takes off and lands on the same back outside edge
- Stair Lift** INCORRECT Helps people up stairs!
- Mouse Jump** INCORRECT Mice don't Ice Skate!
- Twizzle** CORRECT A traveling turn on one foot with one or more rotations
- Triple Axel** CORRECT Nothing to do with mechanics but it is a forward jump with 3 rotations
- Canada Twist** INCORRECT not a figure skating term
- Rocker** CORRECT A turn executed on one foot from a forward to backward (or backward to forward) edge
- Lutz** CORRECT Is a figure skating jump and is named after the Austrian Alois Lutz.
